





DORIS COLGATE:









"WHEN A GIRL LEARNS HOW TO MAKE A SAIL-BOAT GO WHERE SHE WANTS IT TO GO BY USING WIND ALONE, SHE KNOWS SHE IS IN COMMAND."



Over 150,000 students have passed by Port Myers-based Oifshore Sailing School since it opened in 1904 and like Doris Colgate—the school president and CEO—most had never stepped foot on a sailhoat before curolling in the course.

"I didn't know what I was doing." Colgate—recalls about her first sailing lesson, which happened when she was working as an ad-rep for Yachting Magazine in the '60s. "It gave me a a lung sense of self esteem that I could make the board os omething. I was in control."

The ploneering female mariner who literally wrote the book on the subject. "Sailing A Woman's Guide," wanted other gals

to feel the same sense of empowerment she feels at the helm.
When Colgate first started working at the sailing school, which she now owns with her husband, it was mostly men who called in. When I spoke to a man who wanted his wife orgififiend to learn how to sail, she was afraid to try because she thought the sport was too masculine," she says.
In 1999, she founded the National Women's Sailing Audition, part of the chartable Women's Sailing Roundation, to draw women into the sport. Disheartened by the date that there were girls in merginalized areas of here community who never go dual into the ocean, she founded the Women's

Sailing Foundation to expose girls ngss 9 to 14 to sailing. Through NWSA and other initiatives like Adventure/Sall, a mentiorship program for ai-risk youth, she inspires the young women to dream hig. "When a girl learns how to make a sailibot algo where she wants it to go by using wind alone, she knows she is in command." She sugss. Her philanthropic efforts haven't gone unnoticed. In 2016, the Edison Sailing Center named a female sailing event after the role model, the bris' colleget Clinic & Cup, which took place in Lee County, And, this year, Pace Center for Girls named the G-year-ald one of its 2019 Grande Dames for her work.
